Iconic, historic, wild and protected

This is a place where big things happen. From glaciers and dinosaurs to Native Americans and cattle ranchers, the rich history of Paws Up's landscape is yours to discover.

In the 1700s, the Blackfoot River Valley served as a transportation corridor for Nez Perce, Flathead and Blackfeet Indians. Captain Meriwether Lewis followed the trail to arrive in 1806, on his return trip of the famed Lewis & Clark Expedition.

For a time, fur trappers, miners and loggers pursued their wealth here, and an abundance of gold was discovered in 1898 in nearby Garnet, which became a boomtown of 1,000 residents. Then, sometime around 1915, Paul Greenough acquired four homesteads and established the 3,800-acre Sunset Valley Ranch. A man with a well-known sense of humor, Greenough branded the ranch's sheep by painting them with a big green "O."

Over the years, the ranch grew as new owners came and went, from an uncle of Paul Greenough's, John Epperson, to a Hollywood muckety-muck who hosted celebrities like Maureen O'Hara. The Lindbergh Cattle Company took over the ranch in 1965, and the brothers, Land and Jon Lindbergh, orchestrated the formation of the current Paws Up Ranch. A Missoula lawyer, Bob Mullendore, purchased the property in 1991 and teamed up with environmentalists to manage the timber and reroute a large section of Elk Creek to prevent erosion.

Finally, in 1997, the Lipson Family purchased the land and expanded the property to a total of 37,000 deeded and leased acres. It's now a working cattle and bison ranch, a habitat for more than 300 elk, as well as the home of two resorts, The Resort at Paws Up® and the green o®.

Paws Up luxury homes

There are no tall buildings at Paws Up, no long corridors or adjoining rooms. Instead, privacy is part of the package. And the full menu of unique experiences begins with your accommodations.



WILDERNESS ESTATES

A short drive from the Paws Up Village, 10 Wilderness Estates offer expansive ranch and forest views. Each 3,250-square-foot home has three spacious suites, including private master baths, so up to 3 couples can unwind under one big roof, while staying in separate quarters. Amenities include an outdoor hot tub, a large stone fireplace, a full kitchen, a laundry room, Wi-Fi and the use of a Lexus SUV. Every Wilderness Estate sits on four acres of wooded land.



BIG TIMBER HOMES

Just beyond the Paws Up Village and on the way to Spa Town®, 10 Big Timber Homes stand surrounded by scenic woods. Sitting on its own parcel of land, each Big Timber Home welcomes you with a wide front porch. Amenities include an outdoor hot tub on a private deck, a full kitchen, washer and dryer, Wi-Fi and the use of a Lexus SUV. These homes are available in three sizes: one bedroom plus loft, two-bedroom and three bedroom, each of which accommodate various group sizes.



MEADOW HOMES

With panoramic views of pastures and peaks, six Meadow Homes are conveniently located between the Paws Up Village and the Wilderness Outpost. These two-bedroom homes offer unparalleled Western comforts. Each has two full baths, one king-size bed and one queen-size bed. Amenities include a private outdoor hot tub, a full kitchen, a laundry room, Wi-Fi and the use of a Lexus SUV. Each home has its own entrance.

Groups can reserve up to 26 Paws Up luxury homes, with a combined room count of 63.

Sipping wines or handcrafted cocktails only pluses up your mellow.




Event enhancements


