

THE RESORT AT PAWS UP | GREENOUGH, MONTANA FACT SHEET

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Overview	The Resort at Paws Up [®] combines luxury with unforgettable adventure on a 37,000-acre ranch—that's about 60 square miles—featuring untamed Montana wilderness steeped in Lewis & Clark history. Situated on 10 miles of the legendary Blackfoot River (as featured in <i>A River Runs Through It</i>), The Resort at Paws Up opened in June 2005.
	Paws Up boasts more than 100 miles of designated hiking, mountain biking, horse and ATV trails. Outdoor adventures include fly-fishing, cattle driving, rappelling, whitewater rafting, bird and wildlife watching and sporting clays shooting. Winter activities include snowshoeing, cross-country skiing, snowmobiling, skijoring, sleigh rides, ice skating, dogsledding and downhill skiing nearby.
Special Events	Throughout the year and in every season, The Resort at Paws Up hosts special events for its guests to attend. Our longest running culinary events are Montana Master Grillers in May and Montana Master Chefs in September. These foodie-friendly festivals feature award-winning, world-renowned guest chefs, hands-on cooking demonstrations and live music. Other culinary events include WinterFest, Fish and Feast, the Live Fire Legends grilling weekend and the Wonder Women of Food and Wine. The Resort also features the Cowgirl Spring Roundup, Campfire Chefs and Campfire Stars for guests staying in our glamping camps and Wilderness Workshops throughout the year. <u>Click here to learn more about all events held at Paws Up</u> .
Location	The Resort at Paws Up may feel like it's a million miles away from the everyday, but it's easier to get to than travelers might think. Missoula International Airport features a number of major airlines and direct, daily flights. The Resort is located just 35 miles from the airport. Luxury Homes

Wilderness Estates

The 3,250-square-foot Wilderness Estates are ideal for larger families and multigenerational groups. Each of the 10 estates features three large suites with private en suite master bathrooms, and each can each sleep up to eight guests. Guests can kick up their feet and relax on the private deck, soak in the outdoor hot tub or immerse themselves in the comfort of the Western-chic decor in front of a magnificent Montana-sized stone fireplace, and children have a large second-floor loft and game room to explore.

Big Timber Homes

The Big Timber Homes offer spacious accommodations for couples, families, friends and business associates. Each home features a kitchen, a fireplace or wood stove and a full-length private deck overlooking Paws Up's vast meadows. The 10 Big Timber Homes are available in three sizes:

- Three-bedroom/two-bathroom: 2,100-square-foot home with three bedrooms (including a private loft bedroom with two double beds) and two full bathrooms. Each home sleeps up to eight.
- Two-bedroom/two-bathroom: 1,635-square-foot home with two bedrooms and two full bathrooms. Each home sleeps up to six.
- One-bedroom + loft/one-bathroom: 1,200-square-foot home with two bedrooms and one bathroom. Each home sleeps up to four.

Meadow Homes

For couples, families and friends, Paws Up also offers a total of 6 Meadow Homes, each with 1,100 square feet of living space. These single-story homes feature two bedrooms and two bathrooms, a full living room and spacious decks with hot tub and views of the surrounding meadows and mountains. A fully equipped kitchen offers everything you need, including range, refrigerator, microwave and dishwasher. Each home sleeps up to four.

Blackfoot River Lodge

Located in a beautiful private setting on the banks of the Blackfoot River, this 2,955-square-foot home is just a short drive from the Saddle Club at Paws Up. On the main level, the four-bedroom, three-bathroom home features a master bedroom suite with a private office, a full kitchen, a living room, a large second bedroom, a bathroom, a laundry room and four decks with spectacular views of the river. The second floor features a loft area with two bedrooms and one bathroom. Sleeps up to eight.

Moonlight Camp

Moonlight Camp is a collection of six safari-style canvas tents (605 square feet and 975 square feet). With a picturesque view of Lewis & Clark's famous Lookout Rock and just 100 yards from the mighty Blackfoot River, Moonlight Camp has an impressive array of glamping amenities, including electricity, en suite bathrooms, king-size feather beds, Western-chic furniture and private decks. Within steps from each tent, guests have access to a camping butler and a



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Dining Pavilion, where culinary innovations are prepared for guests. Guests enjoy "on-(camp) site" no-tech and fun old-fashioned family games and activities like beanbag toss, horseshoes, football and soccer and complimentary mountain bikes for exploring. Tents sleep 2–5. Opened in 2005.

Tented Accommodations (with Seasonal Availabilty)

River Camp

River Camp is situated along the banks of the legendary Blackfoot River and features six tents: four two-bedroom (830 square feet) and two one-bedroom (605 square feet). Each tent is outfitted with electricity, en suite bathrooms, feather beds, Western-chic furniture and private decks. Within steps from each tent, guests have access to a camping butler and a Dining Pavilion, where culinary innovations are prepared for guests. Kids, teens and adults will all enjoy a dedicated game room located at River Camp featuring table tennis, foosball, video games and a special play area tailored to young children. Tents sleep 2–4. Opened in 2008.

Creekside Camp

Creekside Camp is situated on the banks of Elk Creek and boasts six spacious tented suites: four two-bedroom suites (830 square feet) and two one-bedroom suites (505 square feet). The safari-style accommodations are outfitted with electricity, feather beds, Western-chic furniture, private decks and en suite bathrooms. Within steps from each tent, Creekside Camp guests have access to a Dining Pavilion with a monumental round-stone fireplace, as well as a lounging game area, "creek-front" seating, an outdoor stone fire pit and a camping butler. Tents sleep 2–5. Opened in 2010.

Pinnacle Camp

Pinnacle Camp is located on a bluff overlooking the confluence of the Blackfoot River and Elk Creek—one of the most breathtaking locations on Paws Up's 37,000-acre ranch. Pinnacle Camp features luxurious tented accommodations, with six large tent-suites: four two-bedroom suites (1,030 square feet) and two one-bedroom suites (565 square feet). The camp also includes a dedicated honeymoon tent called Tango Point, located at the point of the bluff directly overlooking the Blackfoot River and Elk Creek. Tango Point adds an extra element of romance with a claw-foot tub located in the living space. Pinnacle Camp is outfitted with a myriad of luxury amenities, including jetted tubs in the en suite master bathrooms, exterior decks with river views and climate-control cooling fans and heaters. Pinnacle Camp guests have access to an expansive Dining Pavilion with a lounging game area and fireplace, a camp chef and a camping butler. Tents sleep 2–4. Opened in 2011.

Cliffside Camp

Situated atop a majestic cliff that overlooks the Blackfoot River and boasts the most expansive views on the entire 37,000-acre ranch, the aptly named Cliffside Camp features six luxurious safari-style tented accommodations (605–975 square feet). Four tents feature two bedrooms with a king-size bed in one and two twin beds in the other, making them ideal for families. The remaining two tents are honeymoon tents that feature a copper tub at the foot of a king-size bed, making them the quintessential romantic accommodations. Each tent includes en suite bathrooms, decks with comfortable seating, an air-conditioning unit to ensure climate control, hardwood flooring and electricity. Cliffside also features an impressive Dining Pavilion with a lounge area, a camp chef and a camp butler. Tents sleep 2–4. Opened in 2013.



North Bank Camp

North Bank Camp is perched on a rocky, timbered bluff overlooking the Blackfoot River. It offers the same uncompromising amenities as our other camps—sumptuous bed linens, en suite bathrooms with heated floors and a camp chef and butler—but North Bank can accommodate larger families and groups with 4 two-bedroom tents and 2 three-bedroom tents (984–1,220 square feet). (The three-bedroom tents have two full baths.) Plus, every single North Bank tent has a riverfront location with a spacious, furnished deck suspended over the slope to afford prime views of the Blackfoot. Moreover, North Bank's Dining Pavilion is our most expansive yet, with a stone fireplace, bar seating, floor-to-ceiling sliding glass doors and spectacular views. As the only Paws Up camp on the north bank of the river, it allows for a more secluded experience. Opened in 2017.

- **Homes with Private Tents** In addition to the six luxury tented camps, 7 of the 27 luxury homes feature a private tent located just outside. It's the perfect adventure for big kids, little kids and parents who want to be kids again for a night. (*Private tents outside luxury homes are available June 1– September 1.*) Click here to learn more.
- the green o Since June 2021, Paws Up Ranch is home to two resorts—The Resort at Paws Up and the green o. the green o is an adults-only, sophisticated Montana woodland hideaway, comprised of 12 design-forward accommodations known as Hauses. At the center of the green o is a freestanding private restaurant venue (the Social Haus), including a lounge area, a dining area, an open kitchen concept and panoramic views of the unspoiled forest. Dining

Restaurant Dining

Centrally located in the Village at Paws Up, the Cook Shack features The Resort's culinary headquarters, with two stellar restaurants and The Resort's full-service bar.

- **Pomp**, The Resort's gourmet restaurant, offers continental cuisine with a Western flair for dinner. Grounded in the fundamentals of classic cooking, our Senior Executive Chef Sunny Jin (a veteran of The French Laundry and El Bulli) uses his background and imagination to create mouthwatering culinary innovations. Local ingredients are featured, so offerings change just like the seasons.
- **Trough** features a more casual menu and atmosphere for breakfast, lunch and dinner. **Tank** provides a wide selection of the finest drink selections in the West and a casual environment complete with flat-screen TVs, music, breathtaking views and a spectacular fireplace. **Tank & Trough** is the perfect place to unwind and reconnect after a day full of adventure.



Outdoor Dining

Camp Dining

For guests staying in any of the six luxury camps at Paws Up, breakfast and dinner are served daily in each camp's Dining Pavilion. (Lunch is served at Trough, Paws Up's casual restaurant located in the Cook Shack.) Each luxury camp has its own talented chef, who caringly prepares breakfast and dinner at the Dining Pavilion. Our summer program Campfire Chefs brings in guest chefs from around the world to cook at our camps, including award winners and finalists and culinary TV show contestants. The chefs prepare sizzling, show-stopping meals right in front of the guests and take haute grilling to a whole new level.

Chuck Wagon

Throughout the summer months, guests can step aboard an old-fashioned hay wagon and enjoy a relaxing ride to the banks of the Blackfoot River for an Old West-inspired chuck wagon dinner. The menu ranges from all-natural chicken, Angus prime rib, fresh corn and asparagus grilled over a campfire to scrumptious classics like baked beans and fresh-fruit cobbler warmed in Dutch ovens. Guests can enhance their authentic Montana experience by pitching horseshoes and enjoying the talents of local musicians and a cowboy poet.

Shed®

Shed started as a food truck on the edge of the forest here at Paws Up—a wood-fired pizza joint, gastro eatery and roadside smoke trailer all in one. This pop-up for live-fire cuisine became such a popular gathering place that we decided to make it a permanent fixture, designed by cutting-edge architect Kristen Becker of Seattle's Mutuus Studio. At Shed, you'll find quesadillas, chili, garlic bread and more. The chefs also prepare sandwiches, elote (grilled corn) and seasonal veggies. In the smoker, cauliflower burnt ends, wings and sausages with combread await foodies. A variety of fresh salads and sides are also available as is a plethora of yummy deserts.

Paws Up Rodeo Dinners

Because we house Montana's premier equestrian center—the Saddle Club at Paws Up—you have an opportunity for a dinner experience that typically rates five horseshoes. Kick things off in the arena with rodeo events chosen just for your group, like roping and barrel racing. There's room for up to 200 spectators, and VIPs can be seated in the Sky Box suite with a fully stocked bar. As the rodeo activities wind down, a feast awaits outdoors near a calm pond, where you can take a canoe ride after dinner and enjoy perhaps the most moving sunset you've ever seen.

The Yard at the Cook Shack

For a crowd-pleasing, down-home meal in the heart of our Ranch Village, The Yard at the Cook Shack provides a magnificent setting throughout the summer. Imagine posing for quintessential Montana photos against the backdrop of the Garnet Mountains, playing pickup games of horseshoes and cornhole, watching world-class chefs serve up mouthwatering cuisine at action stations and then sitting down to dine in picturesque dining pods. Add a built-in stage for live entertainment, and you have the makings of a wondrous evening.



Private Dinner Options

If you or your family members are celebrating a special occasion, feel free to indulge in a private dinner in one of our authentic and charming venues. From the Bunkhouse to the Bull Barn, Tack Room and Island Lodge, The Resort can accommodate your requests and organize a special get-together that the person (or persons) of honor won't forget anytime soon.

Room Service

For guests staying in a luxury home at Paws Up, in-home dining is also available, served in the comfort of the guests' own accommodations. Many of the same menu items available at our restaurants Trough and Pomp can be delivered, or a private chef can create a custom meal for an exclusive in-home dining experience.

Grizzly Gourmet Pizza Delivery

For all luxury home accommodations, The Resort at Paws Up offers pizza delivery, along with salads, sides and desserts—all lovingly prepared on property. (Pizza delivery is included in the Paws Up meal plan.)

Spa Town	Discretely nestled on the edge of an expansive meadow sits Spa Town [®] at Paws Up, a colony of pristine white tents (with full baths and heated massage tables) stitched together by a wooden boardwalk. Services include massages, classes and treatments for children, full-body treatments, treatment enhancements and wellness classes, including a full selection of yoga offerings. Spa Town gives new meaning to "getting lost" in the woods. (During the winter months our spa migrates indoors to a new spa location inside the world-class Paws Up Saddle Club.)
Huff-and-Puff Fitness Center	Guests can use elliptical machines, free weights, medicine balls, Peloton bikes, treadmills, weight benches and yoga balls 24 hours a day, seven days a week in Paws Up's fitness center.
Outdoor Adventures	With 37,000 acres, more than 100 miles of trails and the nearby 1.5-million-acre Bob Marshall Wilderness, Paws Up offers unlimited opportunities for outdoor adventures.
	Resort adventures include:
	• Archery: Our archery range consists of 10 different stations set in the woods, along with two elevated platforms to simulate a tree stand.
	• ATV tours: Organized daily tours, along with mountain biking and seasonal hay rides.
	Boating: Kayak, canoe and raft floats down the Blackfoot River await.
	• Cattle drives: Novice and advanced riders alike will join with seasoned ranch hands to drive a herd of cattle for the experience of a lifetime.
	• Fat Tire Electric Biking: Powered by environmentally friendly lithium-ion batteries, our all-terrain e-bikes quietly scoot over trails and along the fabled Blackfoot River, so you can observe elk and other wildlife as you ride.
	• Fly-fishing: Legendary fly-fishing spots include the famed Blackfoot River (of <i>A River Runs Through It</i>), the Bob Marshall Wilderness, the blue-ribbon South Fork of the Flathead River and other locations.
	• Garnet Ghost Town: Take a walking or biking tour of the best-preserved ghost town in Montana, which is only 20 minutes away from The Resort.



- **Go-karts:** Racers don helmets and goggles to fly gas-powered go-karts through our paved course at speeds of up to 20 miles per hour.
- Hiking: Paws Up has more than 30 miles of designated hiking trails on property.
- **Horseback riding:** Lessons, clinics, grooming/feeding, horse-whispering workshops and organized rides are available.
- Horsepower: Where Mustangs and Mindfulness Coexist: Watch in wonder—outside the ring—as our equestrian manager "gentles" a mustang. See the process in action, as the horse responds to her every move and the pitch of her voice.
- **Paintball:** Paws Up's paintball course accommodates up to 14 people at a time and offers a variety of game scenarios.
- **Paws Up Island Lodge at Salmon Lake:** Like having your own private island to enjoy water sports, fine cuisine and breathtaking scenery. Full-day plus morning, afternoon and evening excursions are available.
- **Rappelling:** Take a deep breath and rappel down the famed Lookout Rock.
- Seeley Lake Jet Ski Experience: Enjoy a quick scenic drive north and hop on a Jet Ski for an exhilarating guided tour of Seeley Lake. From the inlet of the Clearwater channel to remote corners of this glacially formed lake, our team of expert guides will show you postcard-worthy locations of Big Sky Country.
- Sky Line[™] Aerial Adventure Park: Two high-ropes courses push the boundaries of your comfort zone with rickety bridges, spider nets, swinging platforms, tightropes and free falls.
- **Sporting clays:** Shoot sporting clays on a course designed by 14-time national champion Andy Duffy.
- Whitewater rafting: Float down the Blackfoot River (Class I and II rapids) in a raft or inflatable kayak or try Alberton Gorge whitewater rafting, featuring Class III+ rapids.
- **Wildlife watching:** Guided tours are available to view elk, whitetail deer, moose, bears, mountain goats, bald eagles, golden eagles and many others.

Winter Adventures

- Snowmobiling, snowshoeing, cross-country skiing, dogsledding, skijoring, ice skating, sporting clays and sleigh rides are featured winter activities. Guests have their choice of tubing experiences: down a hill near the Wilderness Estates or at the Blast Mountain Tubing and Ice Skating Park (opened in 2020—winter only). A full menu of equestrian excursions is also offered during the winter months, including Cow Croquet, indoor arena lessons and trail rides. And for a real challenge, try the Backcountry Biathlon, featuring a combination of cross-country skiing and target shooting. All necessary equipment is provided.
- Enjoy more winter adventures nearby, such as downhill skiing.

Saddle Club at Paws Up The largest privately owned equestrian center in the state, the 72,000-square-foot Saddle Club at Paws Up boasts a 29,000-square-foot riding arena, a VIP Sky Box suite with a fully stocked bar, a 52-stall barn, equestrian showers, an impressive Tack Room that can seat 20 people for private dinners and acres of outdoor pasture. Run by experienced trainers and ranch managers, the Saddle Club offers private lessons, horse-whispering workshops, group rides, tours and horse-care lessons.



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Children's Program Paws Up has concocted the perfect combination of adventure, education and fun to provide memories that will last a lifetime. The Kids Corps of Discovery is a year-round youth immersion program that replaces screen time with serene time seven days a week. Age-appropriate itineraries are available for toddlers, teens and in-betweens. The Little Discoverers (ages 3–5) engage in everything from shaving cream art and playing in the treehouse to pony rides and a field trip to Garnet Ghost Town. Adventure Club (ages 6–12) participants do cannonballs off a rope swing at the lake, shoot arrows and mine for sapphires. They all eat delicious and healthy meals and make a ton of new friends. Highlights of the program include trips to Harper's Lake and the Blackfoot River. Half-day and full-day programs are available.

Meeting FacilitiesPlanners of meetings and incentives who are hankering for a new venue full of personality
and adventure have unique options at Paws Up. The Resort offers a variety of event and
meeting spaces for any size group, including:

- **The Cook Shack:** a 5,057-square-foot dining venue that features a variety of meeting facilities.
- Tower Office Boardroom: a 10-seat circular boardroom situated above the Cook Shack with expansive views.
- **Pomp:** an 85-seat award-winning restaurant.
- Tank & Trough: a 65-seat casual dining restaurant and bar.
- The Saddle Club: a 72,000-square-foot Equestrian Center that features a variety of meeting spaces including:
 - Arena: a 29,000-square-foot indoor arena ideal for trade shows, rodeos and equestrian exhibitions.
 - **Sky Box:** a 25-seat VIP suite with a fully stocked bar, private restroom and catering facilities.
 - Tack Room: a 20-seat sophisticated barn with saddle-lined walls.
- Lewis & Clark Reception Barn and Lobby: a 200-seat, 6,480-square-foot facility featuring a lobby reception and a theater-style auditorium with a stage, professional sound system and pulldown video screen.
- **The Bull Barn:** a 10,000-square-foot facility with two conference rooms equipped with state-of-the-art audiovisual technology. Large, authentic sliding barn doors lead to the Bull Barn Patio for additional outdoor space. On the second floor is the Great Angus Hall, an expansive, rustic, yet elegant venue for everything from company rallies to Western-chic wedding receptions.
- **The Bunkhouse:** Formerly a hayloft, this traditional barn has been converted into a 24seat conference center with a lounge that features a deck, kitchen, living room, dining room and flat-screen TV.



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Transportation	Most guests at Paws Up do not find it necessary to rent a car. Airport transfers from Missoula are complimentary for guests, and all luxury home accommodations come with a Lexus luxury SUV for transportation around The Resort. Paws Up also offers complimentary transportation to the six tented camps, the Wilderness Outpost and the Equestrian Center. Guests interested in off-property sightseeing, dining or downhill skiing are encouraged to rent a car.
Ownership	The Resort at Paws Up opened in 2005 and is privately owned by the Lipson family.
	Arriving from Colorado, businessman Dave Lipson and his wife Nadine Lipson, together with Dave's son Laurence Lipson, founded Paws Up Ranch LLC in 1997. The Lipsons brought with them a herd of superior horses, the desire to build a first-class Black Angus seed stock operation and their beloved ranch name. The name "Paws Up" was originally inspired by those friendly, wriggling dogs who greet visitors by putting their paws up in the air while their tails thump the floor a mile a minute.
	Paws Up Ranch is an expansive, 37,000-acre parcel of land located in Greenough, Montana, which is located 35 miles east of Missoula, Montana. Paws Up Ranch is a working cattle and bison ranch and is also home to The Resort at Paws Up—a critically acclaimed luxury resort.
Paws Up History	Paws Up Ranch LLC is a land-management, ranching operation and a hospitality company with a focus on developing and managing one-of-a-kind luxury experiential resorts.
	• 1806: Captain Meriwether Lewis of the Lewis & Clark expedition reportedly climbed Sentinel Rock (also known as "Lookout Rock") at Paws Up, looking for the Marias River on his return trip from the Pacific Ocean.
	• 1882: Homesteader Henry Martin staked his claim for gold mining on the area now known as Martin Pasture, just a short distance from the Cook Shack.
	• 1908: Benjamin and Ollie Morris built the Morris Ranch House and opened what would be a long string of cattle ranches on the property. (The Morris Ranch land is now part of Paws Up, and the historic home was completely renovated to become part of The Resort at Paws Up's accommodations.)
	• 1915: Paul Greenough buys the adjoining property, raising sheep and other livestock and constructs several of the buildings that are still used today at The Resort.
	• 1927–1965: The land changes hands several times, but remains a commercial cattle ranch.
	• 1965: Brothers Jon and Land Lindbergh, sons of the celebrated aviator, buy the ranch and operate the Lindbergh Cattle Company, raising Herefords for 21 years.
	• 1986–1997: Two more owners operate cattle ranches before Dave and Nadine Lipson purchase the property and name it Paws Up, after a dog's jovial "paws up" greeting. They build more than 150,000 square feet of new structures, add 100 miles of new fencing and turn Paws Up into one of the top 10 Black Angus seed stock operations in Montana.
	• 2003: After three years of successful ranching and hosting friends and guests on their breathtaking 37,000-acre property, the Lipsons decide to open a resort to share their love for Montana.
	June 4, 2005: The Resort at Paws Up opens!



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Room Rates	Click here for <u>seasonal rates</u> . Nightly rates for each accommodation include three meals per day for two adults. Nightly rate also includes airport transfers, on-property transportation, snacks and amenities in the accommodation. Spa services and guided activities are available separately for purchase. A 20% resort fee per night airport transportation, on-property transportation, use of a Lexus luxury SUV (for guests staying in homes), Concierge Services, Wi-Fi, the Paws Up App and access to the Fitness Center and an extensive trail system. An 8% Montana state lodging tax is also added to the nightly room rate. The Resort at Paws Up is a gratuity-free resort.
Meal and Beverage Plan	The Resort's nightly rates for each accommodation listed are inclusive of three meals per day per person, as well as soft drinks, house wine, beer and liquor with lunch and dinner.
